Both bond proposals passed on November 6, 2018, and even with the resulting millage increase, Grand Ledge Public Schools will have the second lowest millage rate in the region. That is correct - investing in our children and our schools while still maintaining a great low tax rate!

In the months since the election, designing and planning meetings have been the norm across the district. We have had numerous meetings with GMB

Architecture & Engineering and Clark Construction. As was presented, the bond improvements will happen in three phases over the next nine years. Phase 1 will focus on transitioning Beagle into a 7th and 8th-grade building and expanding Holbrook to become a kindergarten through 4th-grade elementary school. Groundbreaking for Phase 1 is scheduled to begin late in the fall of 2019. Completing those two projects will allow us to implement the district's grade restructuring initiative currently scheduled for the 2020-2021 school year.

In order to pay for these construction projects, the district had to sell bonds. The sale of our bonds for Phase 1 of the improvements went exceptionally well. Grand Ledge Public Schools sold \$51,000,000 in bonds, but in the first 90 minutes we received orders for more than three times that amount. Additionally, because of the great demand for our bonds, we were able to negotiate better terms, allowing the community to pay even less for the bond improvements.

This "strong sale" is a direct result of the District's excellent credit rating created by consistent and well-established good financial stewardship. This "strong sale" also resulted in our interest rate being approximately .5% lower than what was projected to the treasury — creating what will be significant savings for our community over the 26-year term of the bonds.



Integrated Pest Management Program

rand Ledge Public Schools has adopted an Integrated Pest Management Program. Inherent with this are the district's efforts to reduce pesticide use as much as possible. While it may be necessary, occasionally, to apply pesticide, this program does not rely on routine pesticide applications to resolve problems. Instead, we use various techniques such as habitat alteration, sanitation, mechanical means or exclusion to prevent pests from becoming a problem.

If it is necessary for the district to utilize a pesticide other than bait or gel formation at your child's school, you will receive advance notice of the application. As required by law, we will post the notice of application at your child's school entrance and in a common area located by the main office of the school. However, if you would like to be notified by first-class U.S. mail, postmarked at least three-days before the application, please contact our Operations Department at 517-925-5430. Give your name, mailing address and what school your child attends. PLEASE NOTE: In an emergency (i.e., stinging bees), pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice immediately following such application.

You may review our IPM program or pesticide application records for your child's school by calling the Operations Department at 517-925-5430 or by emailing our Assistant Superintendent for Operations at johnsonm@glcomets.net.

When school is not in regular session, parents will not receive advance notice by mail.



Don't let a good drop go bad!

Not all water pollution comes from big factories – it's also caused by little household chores.

Hosing off your driveway or sidewalk sends dirt, motor oil, fertilizer, and animal waste into our rivers

and lakes – the very water we drink. So please, sweep instead of hosing. Limit your fertilizer use and avoid applying it before a rainy day. Take care when changing your motor oil. And tidy up after your pets.



How Does Grand Ledge Public Schools Debt Tax Rate Compare to Neighboring Districts?

After passing both bond proposals, Grand Ledge Public Schools still has the 2nd lowest debt tax millage rate.



How much will my taxes increase?

Since both Proposal One and Proposal Two were approved, the first year's debt millage rate is expected to increase by approximately 1.44 mills over the prior year's debt millage rate. This equals approximately an additional \$72.00 per year for each \$100,000 in market value of your home.

Overview of Bond Improvements

PROPOSAL ONESchool Improvements

Proposal One was developed to create **SMARTER**, **STRONGER**, **SAFER** Grand Ledge Public Schools



Proposal One will provide \$118,640,000 for district-wide building and grounds improvements that would address identified and ongoing building issues and would support the district's grade restructuring initiative.







What is the District's Grade Restructuring Initiative?



The grade restructuring made possible by passing the bond proposals will have many positive effects. The grade restructuring initiative is set to begin in the 2020-2021 school year.

Creating K-4th grade elementary schools will mean fewer students in buildings. Kindergartners will start at their neighborhood elementary school, likely the same one where older siblings attend, and not have to transition elsewhere after their first year.

Creating a 5th-6th grade intermediate school will provide flexibility in grouping students for instruction and afford an opportunity for broader curriculum offerings, possibly creating advanced classes along with band and choir. Students will begin to transition away from self-contained elementary methods of instruction to more departmentalized, secondary-school methods.

Transitioning Beagle to a middle school for all 7th-8th grade students will create a secondary school campus with proximity to the high school. Both middle school and high school students can take advantage of the broader curriculum offerings and student services

PROPOSAL TWO Community, Athletics, & Fine Arts Improvements

Proposal Two will provide \$29,485,000 for athletic and fine arts building and grounds improvements designed for district and community use:

- Improving fine arts spaces at the high school by adding a main lobby and support spaces
- Constructing a new competition pool, new community pool, and support spaces
- Remodeling the old pool for alternative community and athletic uses
- Constructing a new community walking track
- Improving athletic fields and support spaces



Transition to Beagle Middle School

Beagle will have a 16-classroom wing added to it in order to accommodate all the students in 7th and 8th grade. A secure entry will be created for the building. The kitchen, serving area, and cafeteria will be remodeled. The gym will be enlarged, plus a new band room and new choir room will be added. There will also be mechanical and electrical system upgrades for efficiency along with restroom and technology infrastructure upgrades.

Add M-43 Connection

A connecting road will be built from M-43 to our secondary campus of Beagle Middle School and Grand Ledge High School. It will be designed to improve traffic flow as well as help with drop-off and pick-up. Some challenges in building this road are Michigan Department of Transportation bureaucracy, access to a GLPS Operations building, and relocating an athletic facility.



Transition to Holbrook Elementary

Holbrook will have eight outdated classrooms remodeled and eight new classrooms added. A secure entry will be created for the building. Parking and drives to support both buses and parents will be constructed. A multipurpose room will be added. There will also be mechanical and electrical system upgrades for efficiency along with technology infrastructure upgrades.

Competition & Community Pool

A portion of Proposal Two is for building a new cold-water competition pool, a new warm-water community pool, and support spaces. The decision was made to begin the pool project in Phase 1 because construction was already going to be happening at Beagle. The competition pool will have 8-lanes so it can be used for league meets and state tournament events.

Phase 1 Planning & Groundbreaking

Numerous planning and design meetings have happened since the November 6 election, and groundbreaking for Phase 1 is scheduled for the late fall in 2019.



In every effort to reduce potential risk, the City of Grand Ledge is tracking and identifying the location of any lead components within the water system. New guidelines set forth by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) requires public water entities to report the type of service line that leads to every home or business they service. When left undisturbed, lead components do not pose a safety risk; but identifying locations of any lead components is crucial to maintaining the water system. We have started tracking this information, but we need your help by self-reporting the type of service line you have in your home or business.

HOW DO I KNOW WHAT TYPE OF MATERIAL IT IS?

Use the following tips to identify the service line material (Note: if the service line pipe is corroded or in otherwise poor condition, only perform the magnet test.) Stop by City Hall to pick up a GL magnet to test your service line!



PLASTIC/PVC

Easy to identify, colors vary, will not attract magnet.



COPPER

Will not attract magnet, reveals shiny 'new penny' color when scratched.



GALVANIZED STEEL

Will attract magnet, reveals silver/white color when scratched.



LEAD

Will NOT attract magnet, reveals silver/white color when scratched.



Morley St. Reconstruction (Orchard to Halbert)



In partnership with private corporation investment, Morley Street will be reconstructed from Orchard to Halbert Streets. Comprehensive Master Plan Update Underway

Delta Township's "Comprehensive Plan for Land Use" is intended to guide Township officials and citizens in making decisions about public facilities and the use of public and privately owned land. The plan is focused on land use and infrastructure and sets forth local goals and objectives for future community growth and redevelopment. It was last updated in 2013 and its 5-year update is underway, consistent with the requirements of the Michigan Planning Enabling Act (Act 33 of 2008). The Planning Department has selected Mckenna to perform the update of the plan. During the update the Township will seek robust public input through events, surveys, and other means. An electronic survey is available on the Township's website at www.deltami.gov. We encourage and would appreciate hearing from as many residents as possible. The update is proposed to be completed by the end of 2019. Residents may view the current (2013) plan also on the Township website. Expanding Water Trail Access in Delta

The Grand River has been designated a water trail as part of the *Middle Grand River Heritage Water Trail*. A water trail is a "designated route along a lake, river, canal or bay specifically designed for people using small boats like kayaks, canoes, single sailboats or rowboats." This designation has expanded grant opportunities for water access which Delta Township has aggressively pursued and will be adding future amenities for the region.

In 2018, Delta Township constructed a new canoe launch on Willow Highway West of Nixon Rd. as part of a DNR Trust Fund Grant. The fully accessible canoe/kayak launch will be completed in the Spring when the final floating dock is added. In 2019, Delta Township will construct another fully accessible canoe/kayak launch at Delta Mills Park as part of another DNR grant. These will compliment a third launch that Delta has been improving at Grand Woods Park.

The Grand River Water Trail is a critically important asset to Delta residents and their quality of life. We will continue to focus on enhancing and expanding access and opportunities for all residents.


