
6th GRADE STUDENT INFORMATION FOR NEXT YEAR

The Michigan Public Health Code requires immunizations for all 7th grade students to be reviewed. We wanted to remind families that they should check in before summer ends with their family physician or the Eaton County Health Department to see if your child is up to date on immunizations. State and Local Health Departments requires GLPS to report immunization information for Kindergarteners, 7th-graders and student's transferring from other districts.
