

Notes from the Office



Last week our building spent a half day focusing on our PBIS expectations in and around Wacousta Elementary. PBIS (positive behavioral interventions and

supports) is the evidence based practice used in all GLPS schools to support our students behaviorally and academically. Students have been working on learning the expectations in their classrooms so far this year and set aside additional time to go over specific expectations at lunch, recess, in the halls, as well as arrival and dismissal. We ended our rotations with a

school wide assembly to practice our assembly skills as well as celebrate our positive interactions with one another. At Wacousta we utilize a common acronym OPEN which stands for: Observant, Protective, Engaged, and Neighborly (for ALL). These expectations are used universally in our school and are broken down into clear expectations that your students should know well if you ask them.

This year we will be celebrating our students weekly in our clubhouse, monthly by teacher nominations, and daily as individual classrooms watch for OPEN behavior to pass our "Bright Buddies" awards around the building. Watch the newsletter for more information about current PBIS news.






