Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Grand Ledge High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Grand Ledge High School has worked hard to identify essential components in courses to focus on. Each content department has also increased focus on universal skills or concepts to increase success among all courses of the same discipline. Our MTSS team utilizes dynamic data to determine needs for possible attendance, academic, or behavioral interventions each week throughout the year. All of our teachers are participating in professional learning groups around school improvement topics meant to improve instructional strategies and create a safe and supportive environment for all students.

All 9th through 12th grade students in Grand Ledge Public Schools attend Grand Ledge High School.
